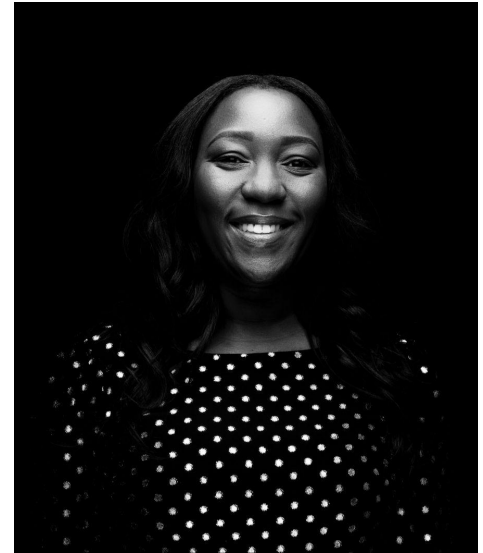

Programs

To carry out our goal of engaging youth, OMTA runs several programs throughout the year. The programs are diverse in nature, including music, dance and radio broadcasts. Additionally, we focus on building partnerships with local organizations. This allows us to create a strong network of committed volunteers, partners and participants who continue to benefit from our activities.



B.R.A.W.L

For the 9th consecutive year we visited secondary schools with an edutainment (education and entertainment) presentation in celebration of Black History Month. The 2019 presentation focused on the contributions of artists, athletes and activists. We visited schools in Quebec, Ontario and Alberta and delivered 40 presentations. Approximately 7,500 youth benefitted from the presentation.



Musical Theatre Summer Camp

From June 25 to August 16, youth between the ages of 5 to 12 acted, danced and sang as they honed their skills in the performing arts. Kids had a fun filled summer becoming confident performers while making new friends. Participants also had the opportunity to perform in original musical theatre production and Aladdin JR at the end of the summer for their family and friends.

Overture Film

Overture Film is a program that introduces youth to film production through videography, video editing, storyboarding and more. Led by a professional filmmaker, this new program allows youth to learn new skills as they work in teams to create original short films and documentaries. Participants conceptualize their film ideas, create original scripts, research and secure locations to film and cast talent.



Youth Arts Retreat

From May 17 to 20 (Victoria Day Long Weekend) youth ages 15-18 spent the weekend disconnecting and creating art. There were guest speakers, interactive workshops in songwriting, music production and visual arts, as well as outdoor activities, campfire and music jam sessions.
